Attorney's Widow Was Philanthropist

Mrs. Katharine G. Fuller, socially prominent widow of Rathbun Fuller, Toledo attorney who died in 1937, died today at her upriver estate, 9 East River Rd., Perrysburg. She was 93.

She had been bedfast and under the care of three nurses since fracturing her hip in February, 1952.

Mrs. Fuller was a large contributor to philanthropic and education institutions, according to her secretary, Elizabeth A. Koster, who supervises the Fuller Estate office at the Toledo Trust Bldg.

Patron Of Groups

She also was a patron of the Toledo District Nurses Association, Toledo Museum of Art, Toledo Zoological Society, Toledo Hospital, and the Old Ladies' Home. She and her husband helped maintain the Jack Miner Sanctuary, Kingston, Ont., the Northfield School in Connecticut and a school in Berry, Ga.

Mr Fuller was considered the dean of Toledo's corporation lawyers and business leaders when he died of a heart attack Dec. 16, 1937, at the age of 80.

Born In Detroit

Mrs. Fuller was born in Detroit, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. John R. Grout. She attended the old Smead School in Toledo. The Fuller home here for many years stood at 2320 Monroe St., which is now the park across from the Toledo Museum of Art. They built their Perrysburg home in 1923.

Mrs. Fuller was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Maumee, the Toledo Country Club and the Carranor Hunt & Polo Club.

Surviving are a niece, Mrs. Donald C. Scott, Pasadena, Calif.; nephews, Orrin G. Wood, Chestnut Hills, Mass., and John W. Grout, Nantucket, Mass.

The body is in the Bennett Mortuary.
