

# Sylvania Man Vietnam Victim

## Hit By Rocket On Mercy Mission

A Sylvania man, Sgt. Carl H. Peters, Jr., 22 died Sunday of wounds suffered in Vietnam Thanksgiving Day, the Defense Department said Wednesday.

Sergeant Peters, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Peters, of 5809 Wakefield Dr., died in Walter Reed Army Hospital, Washington, D.C. He was wounded by a rocket when he went to aid a squad member injured by another rocket, according to the Defense Department. The action occurred during an enemy assault northwest of Saigon.

Sergeant Peters was a squad leader in the 25th Infantry Division and had been in the army since February, 1967. He went to Vietnam in February, 1968.

A native of Teaneck, N.J., he was a graduate of Eaton, O., High School, and had lived in Sylvania three years. He also studied dramatics for two years at Northwestern University.

Also surviving are a sister, Anne, of Cincinnati; a brother, James, at home; grandmothers, Mrs. W. B. Peters, of Appalachia, Va., and Mrs. B. G. Montgomery, of South Hill, Va.

Services were at Fort Myers, Va., with burial in Arlington National Cemetery.
