Retired Principal Of Macomber High

Frederick M. Dannenfels, 82, of 2608 Brookford Dr., retired principal of Macomber Vocational High School, died Monday in St. Luke's Hospital.

Mr. Dannenfels was born in New York City, and taught nine years in Muskegon, Mich., before coming to Toledo in 1919. He began his career in the Toledo public school system as an industrial arts teacher at Waite High School from 1919-1923. He also taught industrial arts at Libbey High School from 1923 to 1926.

Mr. Dannenfels was appointed principal of the old Woodward Technical High School in 1926, and held that position until 1938. During that time, he attended the University of Toledo, earning a bachelor's degree in 1928, and a master of science degree in 1930.

In 1938, Mr. Dannenfels was named the first principal of Macomber Vocational High School. He held that position until retiring in December, 1955.

Mr. Dannenfels was president and a life member in the Toledo Foreman's Club, the American Vocational Association and past president of the Toledo Management Association. He also was a member of the Retired Teachers' Association, Ohio Educational Association, Toledo Personnel Managers' Association, Calumet Lodge, Fort Meigs Chapter, Toledo Commandry, Zenobia Temple, and the Downtown Hi-Twelve Club.

His wife, Esther, who was a schoolteacher, died May 8.

Surviving are his daughter,

Mrs. Ebba Bick, and sons, Frederick and Peter.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Thursday in St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Maumee. The body will be in the Bersticker Mortuary, Heather Downs Boulevard, after 2 p.m. Wednesday.
