

MRS. WATT, 72, TAKEN BY DEATH

Owner of Fell Shop Dies in Summer Home at Catawba Cliffs.

Mrs. Hannah Ervin Watt, 72, died Thursday of heart disease in her summer home at Catawba Cliffs. A resident of Toledo since 1883 and owner of the Fell shop, Mrs. Watt was widely known in Toledo society. Born in Philadelphia, Nov. 17, 1861, she was the daughter of Alexander and Elizabeth Ervin.

The Fell shop was established by Mrs. Watt and Miss Rachael Fell when they came to Toledo 51 years ago. Located for many years in the Secor hotel, Mrs. Watt continued to operate the shop following Miss

Fell's death. A year ago, she moved her business into its present location in the Spitzer building.

She was married to Samuel W. Watt, Toledo, in 1893, and who died in 1898. Mrs. Watt is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Rachael Watt Blodgett, and a granddaughter, Marjorie Manning.

Services will be held at 11:30 A. M. Saturday in the Blodgett home, 4 Harold Arms, 2359 Scottwood avenue, with the Rev. Louis M. Hirschson, Maumee, officiating.

Burial will be in Woodlawn cemetery.
