do and moved with his parents to their summer home in Perrysburg in 1920. He attended

After completing his educa-tion at Yale in 1920, Mr. Secor returned to Toledo and joined the stock brokerage firm of Bell & Beckwith, which had been founded in 1898 by his

partner in the firm in 1927. A low-handicap golfer, Mr. Secor was among those who were instrumental in bringing

the U.S. Open Golf tournament to the Inverness Club in 1957

He was general chairman of the event and was a member of the Inverness Club board of governors and many local and national organizations.

Secor played college Mr. baseball and was active in various other sports. He was

a proficient fisherman made regular trips to Scotland to shoot grouse. He was the winner of the Ohio Senior golf tournament in 1950 and the
