

Jean Boley

Author Of Novels, Magazine Writer

Mrs. Jean Sears Boley, 42, novelist and author, died yesterday in the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edmund B. Besselievre, 617 Valley Dr., Maumee.

Mrs. Boley had written two novels, "The Restless," a story of a crucial year in a woman's married life, and "The Baby Lamb," a satire on American life abroad.

In addition she had been a contributor to Harper's Magazine, the New Yorker, Commonweal and the English Good Housekeeping Magazine.

An article by her has been scheduled for December publication by the Ladies' Home Journal. She wrote under the name Jean Boley.

She had been ill for three years and had been staying with her parents since last December. She was born in Bayonne, N.J.

Before coming to Maumee she and her husband, Herman V. Boley, had been living in London. He is an expert on industrial waste and had worked for the Foreign Operations Administration of the United States government in Indonesia, for the United Nations in Venezuela and for the Argentine government. They had lived in Jakarta, Indonesia; Caracas, Venezuela; Buenos Aires, Argentina, and Washington, D.C.

The service will be private. There will be memorial services Wednesday in St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Maumee, with Dr. Malcolm R. Ward, rector, officiating. Burial will be private.
