Survived Attack On Pearl Harbor

Lawrence M. Hoover, 54, a navy veteran who survived the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941, died Saturday in Medical College Hospital. He lived at 1961 Eastgate Rd.

Mr. Hoover, a navy member for 25 years, served aboard the USS St. Louis as bosun's mate and saw the destruction of most of the U.S. Pacific fleet from his ship, which was one of the few undamaged on the morning of Dec. 7, 1941.

He served for a time as navy recruiter in Toledo. For the last nine years, he was a technician for the Toledo Zoo museum.

He was a member of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association.

Surviving are his wife, Elizabeth; daughters, Gayl, Mrs. Mary Grace Wallace, and Mrs.

Paula Dias; sons, Lawrence and Lester; mother, Mrs. Mame Grill, and sister, Mrs. Shirley Reichert.

The body will be in Coyle Mortuary, Reynolds Road, after 2 p.m. Monday. The Pearl Harbor Survivors Association will have a memorial service at 7 p.m. Monday. Services will be Wednesday at 11 a.m. in Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, Va., where burial will be Thursday.
