

Lorraine Alexander

**Book Reviewer, Widow
of Domestic Court Judge**

Mrs. Lorraine M. Alexander, book reviewer and widow of Judge Paul W. Alexander died Friday in Byrne Book Nursing Home after a long illness.

Mrs. Alexander lived at 420 River Rd., Maumee. She was born in Natick, Mass., and lived in Maumee 48 years.

For more than 30 years Mrs. Alexander gave her witty and educational book reviews in the Toledo area, giving an annual book review series for the Toledo Monnett Club, alumnae of Ohio Wesleyan University, for 25 years.

She also did book series for the Toledo Women's Club and the Up-River Book Club, in addition to many other speaker's requests.

Mrs. Alexander was a graduate of Wellesley College and a member of the Toledo Wellesley Club. Because of her book review work for the Toledo Monnett Club, she was named an honorary member of that club, and an honorary alumna of Ohio Wesleyan University by the trustees and faculty in 1960.

She was an honorary member of the First Emerson Class, the Toledo Sorosis Club, and Samma Gamma, a group of club presidents. Mrs. Alexander also was a charter member of the Toledo bar auxiliary and belonged to St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

Surviving are her daughter, Mrs. Constance Otwell, of Maumee, and three grandchildren.

Her husband, a Domestic Relations and Juvenile Court judge in Lucas County from 1937 to 1967, died June 29, 1967, at the age of 78. He had gained international prominence in both the fields of divorce and juvenile delinquency.
