Marjorie Lu (Meyer) Graham died Tuesday, April 23, 2022, in Perrysburg, Ohio, at the home of her son and daughter-in-law, Daniel and Deborah Graham. The youngest child of Omer and Lulu Meyer, she was born April 8, 1918, in Sandusky, Ohio. She graduated from Schaubler College with honors in religious education, was valedictorian of her class, and for two years was youth minister director for the Congregational Church in the state of Wisconsin. In 1944, she married her high school sweetheart, W. Howard Graham. Marjorie was a contributing factor in Howard's success as an evangelist first at St. Paul's Church in East Toledo, Incarnation in Cleveland, and St. Paul's in Maumee. Howard retired in 1987 and died in 1993.

As a mother, Marjorie granted her children great personal freedom while everything else had immediate moral issues. Her children grown, she became a valued social worker at Toledo Medical Health Center and was later named director of senior care. She served the Synodical Church widely in the Diocese and in the parish. For many years, she volunteered at Riverside Hospital and St. Paul's People Care, and she was a member of both the Synod and the Medical Health Association's boards. Marjorie and Howard were lifelong, and faithful, and supporters of the Roman Catholic Church.

Marjorie had a gentle will and a warm intellect. She was a graceful, dignified, and wise woman, whose legacy lives in all who knew and loved her. Her grandchildren were her joy. She is survived by children, David Thomas, Daniel Deborah, Jane (David) Weber, Ellen Gustafson, and Deborah Allen, and by 12 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.
