Roger H. Smith, 62, a Toledo attorney and former president of the Ohio and Toledo bar associations, died Sunday in his home at 2147 Heatherwood Dr.

Mr. Smith was a senior partner in the law firm of Eastman, Stichter, Smith & Bergman, which he joined in 1940. He was general counsel for the Sheller-Globe Corp. the last two years. Globe Corp. the last two years.

He was chief legal counsel for the Medical College of Ohio during its or-ganization and first years.

ganization and first years. A native of Chillicothe, he was a 1940 graduate of the Ohio State University college of law and served as editor-in-chief of the Ohio State Law Journal. He also taught trial practice as a lecturer at the University of Toledo college of law for 12 years in the 1940s and 1950s.

Mr. Smith was president of the Toledo Bar Association in 1954, and of the Ohio State Bar Association in 1964. A mem-State Bar Association in 1904. A metu-ber of the board of commissioners on grievances and discipline of the Su-preme Court of Ohio, he was named by that tribunal as a member of its rules advisory committee which helped draft the Ohio rules on civil procedure.

He also was a member of the Ohio tate University alumni board and the State University college of law alumni association and its national council.

Mr: Smith had received the Toledo Junior Bar Association's Order of the Heel in 1963, and the University of Tole-do Law Alumni Association's first ando Law Alumni Association's first an-nual "distinguished attorney" of the year award in 1977. He was named the Ohio State University Law School dist-inguished alumnus award in 1968 and received the Ohio State University Alumni Centennial Award in 1970.

Mr. Smith was a fellow of the Ameri-can College of Trial Lawyers, and of the American Bar Foundation. He also was a fellow and trustee of the Ohio Bar Foundation and a trustee of the Toledo Bar Foundation Bar Foundation

Mr. Smith was a member of the Tole-do, Lucas County, Ohio State and Ameri-can Bar associations, Defense Association, American Judicature Society, Toledo Claims Association, American Arbi-tration Association, International As-sociation of Insurance Counsel, and the board of directors of the Ohio Bar Title Insurance Co.
