Robert T. Guyton, a banker with many business interests in Nevada, Ohio and New York, died Saturday, September 25, 1976, of acute peritonitis at the Medical College Hospital in Toledo, Ohio. He was 38 years old.

Mr. Guyton lived in Perrysburg, Ohio, a suburb of Toledo, where he and his family had recently moved from Bedford Village, New York.

Mr. Guyton was senior vice president of the Nevada National Bank in Reno, executive vice president of Lamb Enterprises of Toledo, a holding company with varied business interests in Ohio and other states, and executive vice president of Lamb Communications of Toledo, which operates television stations in Wyoming and Pennsylvania. He was a director of two New York City concerns, Netter International Ltd., a holding company for insurance concerns, and the Argent Investors Corporation.

Mr. Guyton was born in Muskegon, Michigan, and graduated in 1960 from Yale University with a degree in engineering. He received a master's degree in business administration in 1966 from Harvard University.

He is survived by his wife, the former Priscilla Lamb of Toledo; three children; his mother, Margaret Guyton of Lima, Ohio; a sister, Carol Goodell of Wellesley, Massachusetts, and a brother, Richard, of Sacramento, California. A memorial service will be held tomorrow afternoon, September 29, 1976, at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Maumee, Ohio.
